

# SALE OF CHOMETZ

The sale of Chometz is an important law, the observance of which is necessary for the maintenance of kahrus within the Jewish home. Chometz (food or utensils) which is retained over the Passover holidays may not be used after the festival period unless it was previously sold through the procedure prescribed by Jewish law. Our religion provides for the legal sale of Chometz with the Rabbi generally acting as agent.

For those who are unable to contact the Rabbi personally, the following form should be completed and returned to him.

hereby authorize the Rabbi to dispose of all Chometz that may be in my (our) possession wherever it may be; at home, place of business, or elsewhere in accordance with the requirements and provisions of the Jewish law. It is understood that this Chometz will not be my (our) property for the duration of the holiday, and that I (we) will derive no use or benefit from it.
